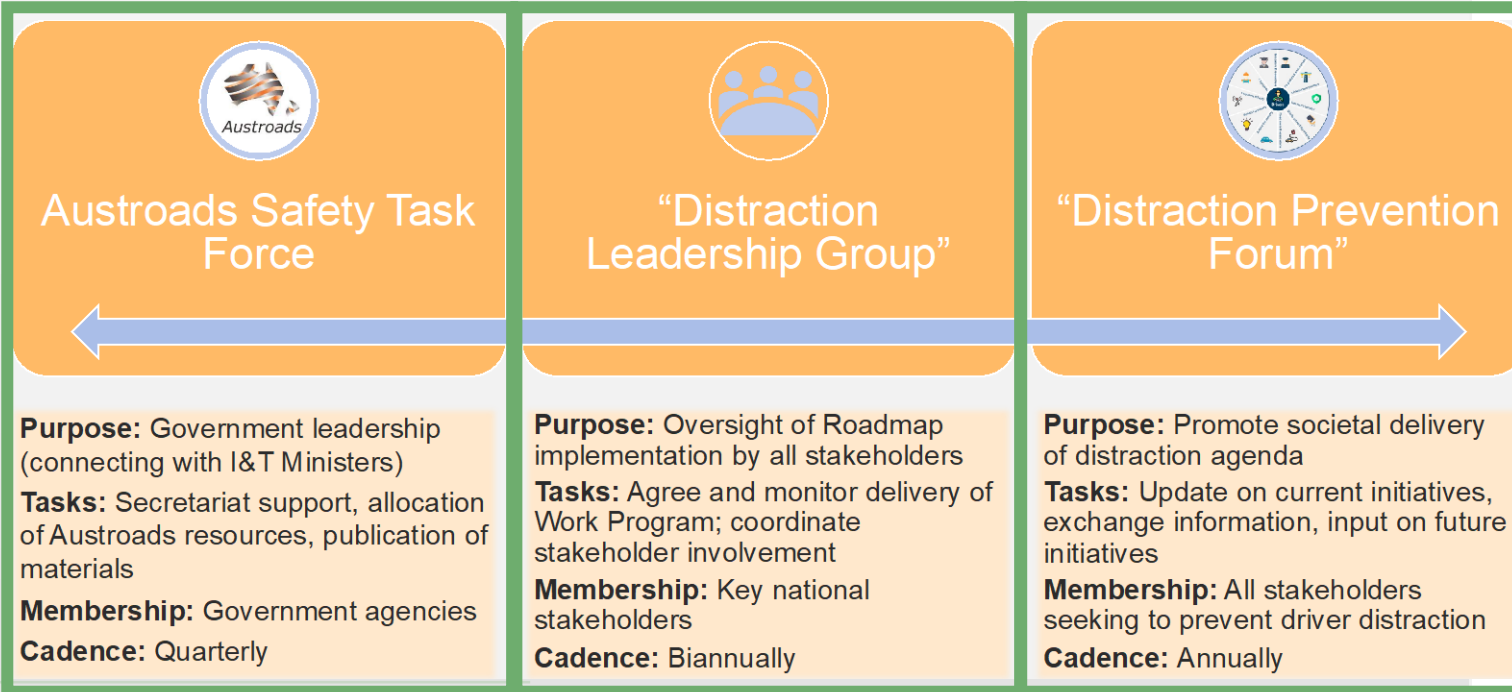


Engage: Discuss the issue with potential partners including how your interests and responsibilities in distraction prevention coincide and present opportunities

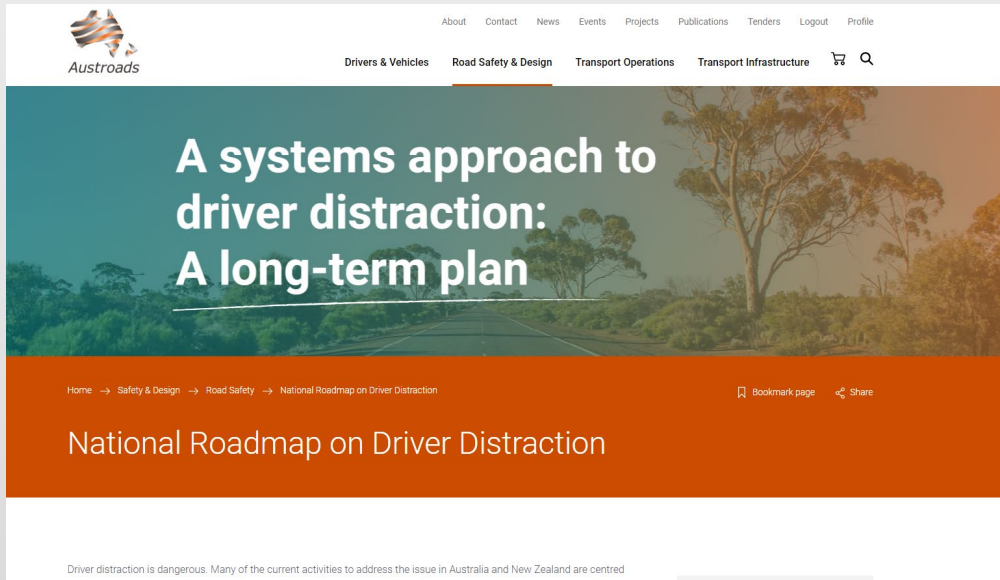
